Navigating the changes under the Procurement Act



The Procurement Act 2023 will mean a new free fully integrated digital platform - a central repository for authority notices and supplier information. Suppliers should be able to access the platform ahead of "go-live" on 28/10/2024.

Authorities and the Platform

Authorities will use the platform to publish notices relating to upcoming and ongoing tenders and to report on contract performance.

The aim: to simplify the bidding process and increase transparency.

Suppliers and the platform

You should be able to use the platform to register business information – and you'll only have to do it once, rather than duplicating this across multiple bids.

You'll be able to access details of new procurement opportunities on the platform as well.



Supplier Registration Platform

The supplier registration platform is part of the central digital platform - it's where suppliers will register and obtain a Public Procurement Organisation Number (PPON), which is a trackable and unique supplier identifier.

Keep a watch out for your opportunity to register.

Individual Authority Platforms

Know the difference: the central digital platform isn't replacing individual authority bidding platforms.

The **central digital platform** will serve as a repository for supplier details at the selection questionnaire stage – but authorities will still use other procurement portals to manage each procurement process and receive bids.
