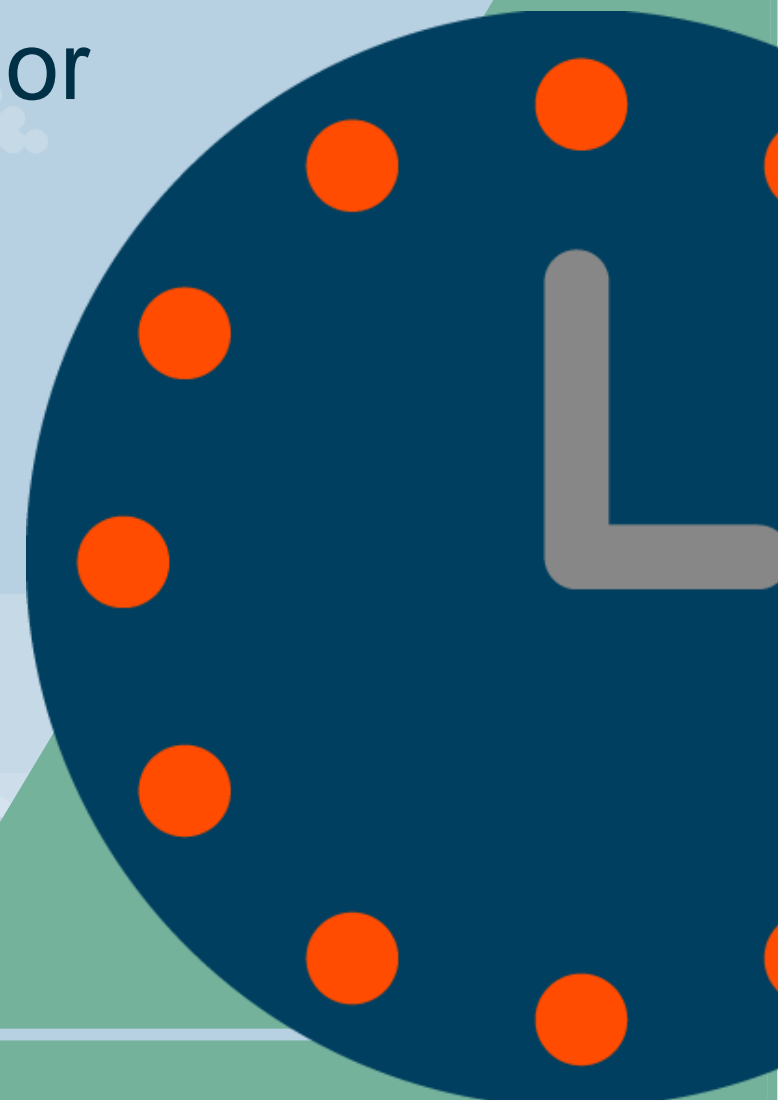


The Procurement Act 2023 has a "go-live" date of 28 October 2024 - but which procurements will it apply to?

Procurement Commencement

If a procurement started **before 28 October 2024**, it and the resulting contract will be governed throughout their lifecycle by the 'old' procurement regulations:

- The Public Contracts Regulations 2015,
- Utilities Contracts Regulations 2016,
- Concession Contracts Regulations 2016, or
- Defence and Security Public Contracts Regulations 2011



Existing Contracts

Any contract or framework awarded under the 'old' procurement regulations will continue to be governed by those regulations. It'll be **business as usual**.

Existing Frameworks

A contract called-off under an existing framework from **28 October 2024** onwards will be governed by the 'old' procurement regulations. The 'old' regulations will remain relevant until the last call-off contract under those frameworks expires.

Modifications

Need to modify an existing contract?

If an existing contract needs to be modified (even after 28 October 2024), it'll be done in accordance with the previous procurement regulations. This is because the existing contract will have been procured under the previous regulations.



New Procurements

New procurements commenced on or after **28 October 2024** will be under the Act and the **new rules will apply**.
